 2. Lattices and their dual lattices
 3. A simple proof of equivalence of tiling and exponential orthonormal basis
2. Exponential Riesz bases, Paley-Wiener spaces, and the correlation ([3])
 1. Exponential Riesz bases
 2. Paley-Wiener spaces
 3. Necessary and sufficient condition for exponential Riesz bases
 4. Existence of Riesz basis of vector valued functions

In 1974, Bent Fuglede conjectured that a domain Ω in \mathbb{R}^d admits an orthogonal exponential bases $\{e^{2\pi i b \cdot}\}_{b \in B}$ if and only if \mathbb{R}^d can be tiled by a family of translates of Ω . Fuglede ([2]) proved this result when B is a lattice in \mathbb{R}^d . A proof of this result due to A. Iosevich ([1]) will be given in the first part of the course.

The second part of the seminar will be dedicated to relate Riesz bases of exponentials for $L^2(\Omega)$ to similar properties of the translation systems in the Paley-Wiener space $PW_\Omega = \{f \in L^2(\mathbb{R}^d) : \hat{f}(\xi) = 0 \text{ a.e. } \xi \in \Omega^c\}$.
